The FACTS about street **FENTANYL**

There is no such thing as a safe street drug. Know the risks.

Fentanyl is often **added** to other illegal drugs without people knowing.

Fentanyl has been found in:

- Heroin
- Meth
- Fake pills (Oxycodone, Norco, Xanax)
- Cocaine

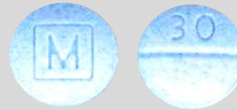
Fen•tanyl
[fen-tuh-nil]

An opioid narcotic, a prescription drug used for cancer patients in severe pain.

It can be absorbed through the skin. You can't **see** it, **smell** it, or **taste** it.

Warning signs of **A FENTANYL OVERDOSE:**

- Discolored skin: blueish-purple for light-skinned people, or greyish for darker-skinned people
- Snoring, gasping, or gurgling sounds– also known as the “death rattle”
- Extreme muscle rigidity, to the point of seizures
- Foaming at the mouth
- Blood from nose and mouth
- Weak, barely-detectable pulse



If You Use Substances



Have Naloxone

Overdose happens fast. Make sure you and your friends carry Naloxone/Narcan.



Don't use alone

Make sure someone is around. They can give Naloxone/Narcan if you overdose.



Call 911

If you think it is an overdose, **call 911**. Be anonymous or stay and offer support.
